Dramatic Arts, Grade 10, Open (ADA20)

Course Details:

This course requires students to actively explore dramatic forms and techniques, using their own ideas and concerns as well as sources selected from a wide range of authors, genres, and cultures. Student learning will include identifying and using the principles of space, time, voice, and movement in creating, sustaining, and communicating authentic roles within a drama. Students will assume responsibility for decisions made in the creation and presentation of the drama, and will analyse and reflect on the experience.

Theatre Vocabulary 3 days
Script Work 3 weeks
Family Conflict Tableaux 2 weeks
Final Presentation 5 weeks

Learning Skills:

Students are expected to take an active role by participating in class activities, completing all assignments in a timely manner and seeking help when appropriate. It is also expected that students respect the learning environment of their classmates. Punctuality and attendance play a key role in the student's success. Students who are absent for reasons other than extracurricular activities should provide the teacher with a note of explanation the day they return. Time management, self-motivation and direction, positive attitude and taking responsibility for shared work are **major** skills required for success in this course.

Evaluation:
